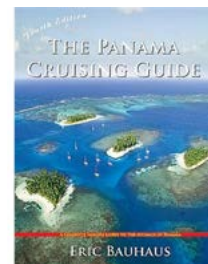
Chris Doyle's Sailors Guides

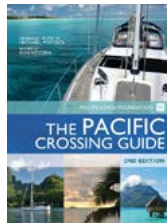

Entry Requirements

Darwin Pest Control Procedure

To prevent the introduction and spread of marine pests, the Northern Territory Government has developed protocols for yachts entering Darwin. Two marine pests have been identified as threats to the local environment, namely the Black Stripe Mussel found in Panama, and the Ocean Green Mussel from Cairns. As World ARC yachts will have passed through these areas they will have to undergo a hull inspection and internal seawater system treatment on arrival in Darwin after which a certificate will be issued allowing yachts to go into any of the Darwin marinas.

On arrival in Darwin, yachts will be directed to go to an anchorage or a treatment site at Cullen Bay Marina Waiting Pontoon before proceeding into a marina. Marine Fisheries will visit each yacht. Divers will inspect the hull of the yachts. Yachts recently antifouled in Australia may be exempt if receipts and invoices are produced. A treatment of all seawater inlets and outlets will then take place - this takes up to 14 hours. You will be unable to use any through-hull fittings during this period (sinks, engine etc).

Local Dangers

Saltwater crocodiles (salties) are the most dangerous animals in the north of Australia. Attacks are rare, but usually fatal. There are lots of salties in the Darwin area, and sea bathing should be avoided.

Box jellyfish (marine stingers) are usually found between October and May, but stinging jellyfish can be found at all times. Take local advice before swimming. In case of stings, douse liberally with vinegar and seek urgent medical attention.

General

Lying at Australia's 'Top End', Darwin is the biggest city in the Northern Territory – a region comprising one sixth of the country's landmass, and an area where visitors can experience the awesome grandeur of the Australian Outback at first hand. Basking in a warm tropical climate the city is delightfully laid-back and is now a tourist destination, famed for its markets and festivals, Asian cuisine and massive natural harbour (and tides!), as well as being a gateway to the interior.

In Darwin yachts will be able to lock into one of the Port of Darwin's marina facilities, conveniently situated close to the centre of town and the marine repair facilities.

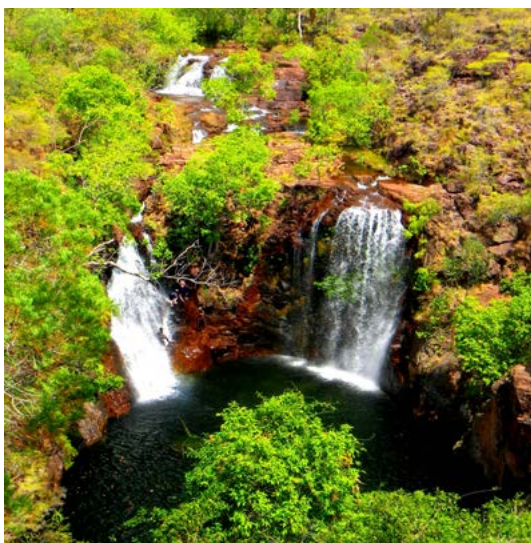
Darwin has much to offer the visiting yachtsman, with plenty of exciting tours and excursions of the Northern Territory. Nearby Kakadu National Park (a UNESCO World Heritage Centre), is well worth a two day trip, and closer at hand are Litchfield National Park and Casuarina Coastal Reserve. Darwin itself has plenty to offer with several evening markets and an unusual outdoor deckchair cinema! There is also a selection of international cuisine throughout the town, and a great welcome at the Dinah Beach Cruising Yacht Club and Darwin Sailing Club.

Don't Miss

Litchfield National Park. Together with stunning tropical waterfalls and swimming holes, this is a truly beautiful destination, located just south of Darwin. Litchfield National Park features numerous waterfalls which cascade from a sandstone plateau called the Tabletop Range, plus monsoon rainforest, intriguing magnetic termite mounds and historical sites.

Kakadu National Park. A cultural landscape rich in Aboriginal sites and a terrain bound up by the creation myths of "the Dreamtime", a period 50,000 years ago when humans first explored the continent. Mooring

Whilst in Darwin, yachts can choose to stay at anchor, or use one of the several marinas in the city. The two marinas most used by visitors, and by World ARC yachts are Tipperary Waters and Fisherman's Wharf (also known as the Duck Pond). The complimentary berthing for three nights before departure will be provided at either of these.

Tipperary Waters Marina is usually the marina chosen for the monohulls that can access the lock (max LOA 21.5m, beam 6m, draught 3m).

Full marina facilities available. Standard lock opening times are 0600-2100 daily. The lock is accessible when tidal levels are 4m above chart datum. A live-aboard surcharge of \$14/day for first two crew, plus \$8 per subsequent person covers water and electricity. Lockmaster on VHF Ch 08 (call Tipperary Lockmaster). The World ARC office will be based in Tipperary Waters.

Fisherman's Wharf (or the Duck Pond). This is a commercial fishing harbour that welcomes yachts. The facility is mainly used for catamarans and larger boats that cannot enter the marinas with narrower locks. Berthing facilities consist of piled wharfs 200m in length and dredged to 4m. Electricity and fresh water. Basic toilets and showers are available. Lock master Tel: 04 0111 7062

Mooring Port Authority mooring balls may be available at the entrance to Tipperary Waters Marina. These must be booked in advance. Ask Rally Control for more information if you are interested using these.

Anchoring There are two anchorages for yachts in Darwin, the first located west of the Darwin Sailing Club in Fannie Bay (approximately 12°25'S 130° 50'E). This is a public anchorage area and there are no set moorings - you are free to anchor anywhere suitable. The prevailing offshore south and east breezes make this a pleasant anchorage, but check the tides and depth as the range in Darwin exceeds 7m. There is usually good holding in mud. You can leave your dinghy directly in front of the sailing club buildings - please keep the beach south of the club free for rigging sailing dinghies. The Darwin Sailing Club welcomes visiting yachts and offers full facilities including showers and garbage/rubbish bins. The second anchorage is located east of Darwin Wharf (approximately 12°28'S 130°51'E), but this is exposed to the south east winds that prevail in July and August, and there are no facilities nearby. Dinghies can be left at the pontoon on the wharf, and the town centre is a 20 minute walk.

TRS Refund Scheme

The Tourist Refund Scheme (TRS) enables you to claim a refund, subject to conditions, on the Goods and Services Tax (GST) and Wine Equalisation Tax (WET) which you pay on goods you buy in Australia.

CONDITIONS OF THE SCHEME

To claim a refund you must:

- spend A\$300 (GST inclusive) or more in a single store
- claim the GST back on purchases made within 60 days of your departure date from Australia
- carry the goods on board your yacht and present the original tax invoice and your passport & ships papers to a Customs officer on your departure from Australia
- present your claim at a time as instructed by the Rally programme

HOW TRS WORKS

You may buy several lower-priced items from one store, either at the same time or over several occasions within a 30 day period, provided the total purchase amounts to A\$300 (GST inclusive) or more. You need to ask the retailer to consolidate these lower-priced purchases onto a single tax invoice. Be sure the retailer will do this before you buy the goods. You may buy goods from several stores, provided each store's tax invoice totals at least A\$300 (GST inclusive).

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO WHEN BUYING GOODS

If you wish to claim a refund, you must obtain an original tax invoice from the store. All stores registered for GST will be able to give you a tax invoice. A refund cannot be given without it. Tax invoices for purchases of A\$1000 or more must contain additional information, such as the name and address of the buyer.

Entry Requirements

Each boat needs a CAIT cruising permit. The World ARC rally control team will organise your CAIT, and we will ask you for information for this in early June.

Customs and Immigration

World ARC will clear in and out of Bali at Benoa.

Visas

Countries whose citizens can obtain an Indonesian **Visa on Arrival** include Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, South Africa, South Korea, Switzerland, Taiwan, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, USA. A 30 day visa on arrival costs US\$25 and payment can be made in US dollars or local currency. Citizens of countries not listed above must obtain a visa from an Indonesia diplomatic mission in advance. Visas in advance can be organised at the **Indonesian Consulate** in Darwin, 21 Harry Chan Avenue Tel: 8943 0200 Open: Mon-Fri 0900-1300; 1400-1630. Contact them well in advance.

General

Bali is one of 17,508 islands that make up

Indonesia. It sits eight degrees below the equator between Java and Lombok in southeast Asia, just above the northwest edge of Australia. The island is 90 miles long and 48 miles wide. The Bali Sea laps ashore from the north and the Indian Ocean from the south. Denpasar ranks as its largest city.

Bali Marina at Benoa, is half way between the tourist towns of Sanur and Kuta on the south east coast of the Island, and only 30km from the famous town of Ubud, the arts and crafts capital of Bali. This quaint town has souvenir shops, woodcarvers, artists, lots of restaurants, and a nightly Hindu play at the King's palace. Stay at least one night and preferably two.

Local tours can be arranged through the World ARC travel agent in Bali Marina, or through any number of companies downtown. The highlights include rice paddies, Hindu temples and the volcanic lakes of Bratan and Batur on the north side of the island.

Bali's dive sites offer great diversity: vertical walls and sand slopes; shipwrecks both steel and wooden; limestone shorelines and black, volcanic outcrops; peaceful bays and ripping currents; deep, coral-covered ridges; shallow sea grass beds and big bommies (submerged reefs) with both shore and boat-diving. The pelagics you can expect to see include manta rays and the awesome whale shark.

Mooring

Bali International Marina is located in Bena Harbour. The leading marks begin at the sea buoy at 08°45'14"S, 115°14'55"E. Follow the leading marks (just below a lone palm tree on the hill above) on a course of 255° True, past buoys #1 and #2 to the beginning of the dog-leg channel. Maintain a course close to the red (port) side channel markers (stay clear of all green markers). Continue 30m past the last buoy #8 before turning north (staying close to the main ship wharf - portside) to the marina. We recommend a slack tide arrival if possible.



Night time approach is possible but the navigation lights are not easily visible against the brightly lit background. The port is officially closed at sundown and you may wish to check your yacht insurance.

Facilities

There is 24 hour security in the marina with CCTV cameras, but take precautions as usual. Marina accounts for berthing fees, laundry and meals in the marina restaurant can be arranged in the Business Centre (marina office). Payment can be done in USD, IDR, Visa or Mastercard.

Car rental can be arranged through the marina business centre, but foreigners are not strictly allowed to drive in Bali. Driving standards are generally poor and the police often stop tourists who drive.

Most non-Australian citizens will require an eVisitor or ETA. Crews who previously obtained visas for the World ARC stops in Australia will not need to reapply if their visa is still in date.

It is essential that individual crew members apply for a temporary visitors visa online at www.eta.immi.gov.au, before departure from Bali. Failure to do so will result in considerable fines.

Visas

Cocos is an Australian territory, and so all crews will need to comply with Australian visa requirements. Most non-Australian citizens will require an eVisitor or ETA. Crews who previously obtained visas for the World ARC stops in Australia will not need to reapply if their visa is still in date.

It is essential that individual crew members apply for a temporary visitors visa online at www.eta.immi.gov.au, before departure from Bali. Failure to do so will result in considerable fines.

Entry Requirements

Customs and Immigration are located on West Island, at the Police Station at Nelson Mandela Walk. The Australian Federal Police are responsible for all Customs, Immigration and general police enquiries. Tel: 9162 6699.

Yachts must contact Rally Control or Cocos Police VHF Ch 20 to arrange clearance. Once cleared by Customs, you are free to leave your boat and explore ashore.

Fruit and Vegetables

Under the new quarantine regime for the

Australian Indian Ocean Territories, including Cocos, no food is to be brought ashore from countries other than mainland Australia, including Bali and Christmas Island. Fresh fruit and vegetables may only be transported from Australia if free from pests and diseases, clean, and free from soil and other contaminants. You may be asked for your fresh fruit and vegetables on arrival in Cocos by the Customs or Quarantine officers as part of the clearance process.



Direction Island

Mooring

The World ARC anchorage will be at 'Port Refuge' on Direction Island. This is 1.5nm north of Home Island, and 4.5NM east of West Island. Travel by dinghy is possible to Home Island, but you will need to catch the ferry to West Island. See Travel Information.

Facilities

Supplies on the Island are limited. Fresh supplies come from Perth by air, and a ship visits every 4-5 weeks with dry goods. It is therefore recommended that you do a proper re-stock of provisions in Darwin, with a top up in Bali and Christmas Island. There is a small variety of shops offering an excellent range of t-shirts and souvenirs, snorkelling gear and fishing tackle and duty free items. Just to add to the challenge of shopping, opening hours differ with each business.

In order to cope with the demand by World ARC participants, the Cocos Islands Co-operative Society (a group of local community based businesses) are assisting us with pre-ordering supplies for the World ARC fleet. Order forms for each yacht will be distributed in advance and the Co-operative will endeavour to procure everything that is asked for. Details of where to collect supplies will be distributed on arrival. Participants however must be aware that World ARC's visit coincides with the Island's busiest time of the year, and therefore shortages are possible.

General

This tiny horseshoe shaped jewel lies right in the middle of the Indian Ocean, 2750 km north-west of Perth and 900 km west south-west of Christmas Island, its closest neighbour and another island of the Australian Indian Ocean Territories. The Cocos Keeling Islands were occupied by the Clunies-Ross family in 1827, who established and developed coconut plantations throughout the islands. With them they brought labourers from Africa, China, Java, Borneo and Malacca, a group who now form the Malay community on the Islands. Queen Victoria granted freehold title to all land on the islands in 1886, and in November 1978 they became an Australian Territory.

The Cocos Keeling Island group comprises of 27 coral islands forming 2 atolls. The northern atoll is a single uninhabited island, North Keeling Island National Park. The main atoll is 24 km to the south and is a horseshoe chain of islands encircling a lagoon. Of the 25 islands here, only 2 are inhabited, Home and West Island. Both islands have a number of services.

Direction Island The World ARC anchorage will be at the stunning and safe 'Port Refuge' on Direction Island, found at the NE corner of South Atoll, and the only place where visiting yachts are permitted to anchor in Cocos Keeling. It is an idyllic stop with beautiful clear water, waving palm trees, a mile of sandy beach and essential supplies a dinghy ride away. There are shelters on the on the Island where cruisers get together to cook supper, drink, and exchange tales.

Home Island 1.5NM south of the Direction Island anchorage, has a population of approximately 600 Cocos Malay. Here the Muslim faith is strictly observed and the local dialect of Malay is spoken.

When using your vessel's tender to go to Home Island you are advised to follow the channel markers, as there are numerous shallow areas and coral outcrops along the route.

West Island 4.5NM west of the Direction Island anchorage, has a population of approximately 120. It is the administrative centre for the Islands and normal western dress is acceptable.

Home Island Cultural Tips

Be mindful of the need to dress conservatively out of respect to the Muslim community. Minimum standards of dress requested are long shorts, t-shirts/shirts, sarong.

Shoes should be removed when entering a house or mosque.

Unless the front door of the house is wide open, it is considered more polite to go around to the back door than to knock on the front.

Cocos Malay people use their right hand for eating, giving and receiving and will appreciate if you do the same when meeting them.

Refrain from touching a person on the head.

Don't Miss

Snorkelling the Rip: There is a shallow cut at the east end of Direction Island where the water flows continuously into the lagoon, known as the famous 'Rip'. Renowned for its diverse marine life of beautiful fish, corals, reef sharks, huge wrasse and parrotfish, this should not be missed.

Reef Walking: One of the most outstanding features of both atolls are their near intact coral atoll ecosystem. The outer reef slope descends to the sea floor, sometimes gently, sometimes a steep cliff face. It is at the top edge of the slope that the waves break, especially on the 'weather side' where the reef faces the prevailing winds. Even if you are not able to snorkel you can still see many of the beautiful marine creatures, corals and sea grass close to shore. Tiny moray eels, sea urchins, beautiful marine fish, sea cucumbers, turtles and colourful clams are usually found in relatively shallow water. Be aware that protective footwear is a must and don't forget, you are possibly walking on someone's home!

Turtle Spotting: Head to the jetty in the evenings to watch the numerous turtles pop up their heads to take a breath before submerging. Sometimes you may even be treated to manta rays cruising around the jetty.

Visit **Home Island Museum** and familiarise yourself with the chequered history of Cocos (Keeling) Islands and all the details relating to Australia's first Naval victory: the sinking of SMS Emden

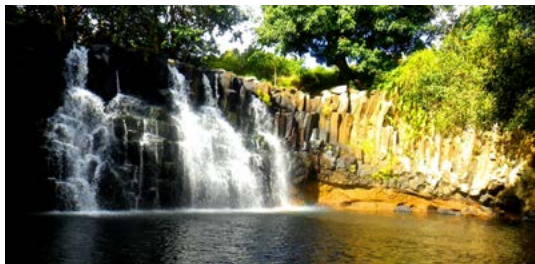
Visas

Visas are not required for people travelling on an EU, American, Israeli, South African or Australian passport. However, we recommend you check online www.maurinet.com/tourist_information/visa_information

Crew arriving by air: Skippers must write a letter confirming that they take responsibility for any crew members arriving by air without an onward ticket. A copy of the letter and of the crew member's passport must be sent to Mauritian Immigration before arrival. Rally Control can provide suitable text and contact details for the skipper's letter.

Entry Requirements

Yachts may be asked to clear with Customs and Immigration before berthing. The Customs house is in the north east corner of the harbour, with a grey slate roof.

General

Mauritius is famous for an ex-resident; the now extinct dodo. The dodo was a flightless bird which was hunted to extinction in 1660, soon after the Island was first visited by sailors. Some of Mauritius' current attractions include sugarcane plantations, dramatic mountains, and some of the finest beaches and aquamarine lagoons in the Indian Ocean.

Visitors are struck by the island's cultural diversity; Mauritius has a distinct Indian flavour, seasoned by African, Chinese, French and British cultures. This mix is reflected in the food, music and sounds of the island.

Don't Miss

Dodo spotting(!): Try in the beautiful **Sir Seewoosagur Ramgoolam Botanical Gardens** at Pamplemousses, which are well worth visiting. To see a stuffed dodo, visit the Natural History Museum on Chausee Street in Port Louis.

Carri Poisson: The carri is one of the main dishes of Mauritius, a rich spicy onion sauce influenced by Indian cuisine. After you've tried carri poisson (fish curry), other dishes will taste bland.

Shopping: Hunting for bargains in the downtown market in Port Louis – don't forget to haggle!

Undersea walks: In Grand Baie you can stroll along the seabed feeding the fish while wearing lead boots and a diving helmet.

Reading: Book shops stock both French and English books. Try local author Malcol de Chaza's *Petrusmok* or Jacques-Henri Bernadin de St. Pierre's *Paul et Virginie*, set in Mauritius at the time of the French Revolution.

Music: Listen to Jean Alphonse Ravaton, alias TiFrère, singing African-inspired traditional music called *sega*, or to creole singer Jean Claude-Monique.

Caudan Waterfront in the capital Port Louis, is the home for World ARC in Mauritius. The island is a perfect location to recover from the long Indian Ocean passage – Caudan Waterfront is also a sophisticated shopping mall, and the vibrant tropical city of Port Louis is just through the underpass. Visas

Réunion is part of France, but not part of the Schengen treaty, so a standard French visa is not accepted in Réunion. Most nationalities do not need a visa for stays of up to 3 months. General

Réunion, sheer and lush, is the tip of a massive submerged prehistoric volcano. The mountains, best visited in the early morning before the clouds gather, are easily accessible by road but extensive trails allow you to get off the beaten track. There are so many things to do in Réunion: you can ride a car, jeep, motorbike or horse up a mountain and cycle, raft or canyon back down again. You can fly over it in a light plane, helicopter or paraglider. Once back at sea level you can dive, surf or fish. Or you can just go hiking in the three extraordinary cirques, the active Piton de la Fournaise volcano or Piton des Neiges – Réunion's highest peak.

Administratively, Réunion is one of the overseas departments of France and an integral part of the

Republic with the same status as those situated on the European mainland. Réunion is therefore an outermost region of the European Union. Curiously, Réunion was the first region in the world where the Euro became legal tender, due to its location in a time zone to the east of Europe. French culture dominates every facet of life, from the coffee and croissant in the morning to the bottle of Evian and the carafe of red wine at the dinner table. However, the French atmosphere of the island has a firmly tropical twist, with subtle traces of Indian, African and even Chinese cultures. Just as you are thinking Réunion is more French than France you turn a corner and come across an exquisite Hindu temple.

In keeping with the French love of perfume, Réunion has long been the garden of the great fragrance houses of Paris. The mainstays of the essential oils business are geranium, vetiver and the evocative ylang ylang, which you can often smell in the night air over the island. Vanilla is also grown here; in Bras-Panon in the east part of the island you can smell and visit the vanilla processing plant.

Don't Miss

Tasting: Vanilla steeped rum arrangé (a mixture of rum, fruit juice, cane syrup and a blend of herbs and berries).

Canyoning: Canyoning is walking, sliding, rappelling and swimming down Réunion's spectacular canyons; trips are run for beginners or the more adventurous.

VTT: Velo tout terrain is downhill mountain biking. There are special biking trails winding through forests and down mountains. You can ride from the higher parts of Le Maito down to the coast.

Le Port

In Réunion World ARC yachts will be berthed alongside the wall near the recreational craft harbour, within the Commercial Port. The tidal range is around 0.5m. Boats may be asked to raft two deep. The small town of Le Port is a 20 minute walk away and is 15km from the capital St. Denis. The harbour is not the most attractive but is secure and offers sheltered berthing – ideal as a base whilst exploring this stunning island. As Réunion is a district of France, clearing in is relatively simple, as is ordering parts from Europe.

One of the largest natural bays in South Africa it is now one of the most important harbours of the country. The town itself is becoming the holiday destination of the Natal coast, with fishing, beaches, and estuaries close by and game reserves within 1-2 hours drive. The

Game Parks north of Richards Bay are fantastic and, compared to those further south, are home to many more animals. Richards Bay's surrounds have vast expanses of untouched and unspoilt indigenous vegetation as well as natural lakes and marshes, making KwaZulu Natal one of the most picturesque tourist destinations in the country.

World ARC participants are advised to use Richard's Bay as a base to travel up to the famous Kruger National Park and also the Drakensburg ranges which give a fascinating insight in to the lives of the Zulu and Xhosa peoples.

Don't Miss

The Big Five: This is Africa! Get off the boat and go on safari inland and spot Lion, Leopard, Elephant, Buffalo and Rhino.

Lake Mzingazi: The primary water supply of Richards Bay is a popular tourist attraction offering visitors the chance to view Nile crocodiles and hippos as well as over 350 species of birds - making it a bird watcher's paradise.

Richards Bay Game Reserve: Set up to protect lagoon animals formerly subject to intensive hunting, the reserve features a prodigious number of aquatic birds and animal species including hippos and crocodiles.

Ukhahlamba Drakensberg Park: a World Heritage Site and one of South Africa's prime eco-tourist destinations offering great open spaces in a world of gigantic peaks and soaring basalt buttresses just two hours from Durban.

Entry Requirements

After mooring, yachts must visit the Immigration and Customs offices ashore. Immigration is located on the 5th floor of the State Warehouse near to the Cape Town International Conference Centre on the Waterfront.

The Customs office is located at 22 Hans Strijdom Avenue (use the entrance on the corner of Long Avenue). A taxi may be the best option from both RCYC or V&A Waterfront.

General

Cape Town, the gateway to South Africa, is one of the most evocative cities in the world thanks to its unique position at the tip of Africa separating the Atlantic and Indian oceans; its varied colonial history and its position close to the region's best wineries.

Cape Town provides the setting for many scenic wonders, from mountainous views to sandy beaches, colonial farmsteads and buzzing urban nightlife, there is something for everyone. The cable car was first opened in 1929 and today conveys some 600,000 people to the summit annually. On the summit there is a restaurant and a souvenir shop, from which letters bearing the Table Mountain postmark can be sent. 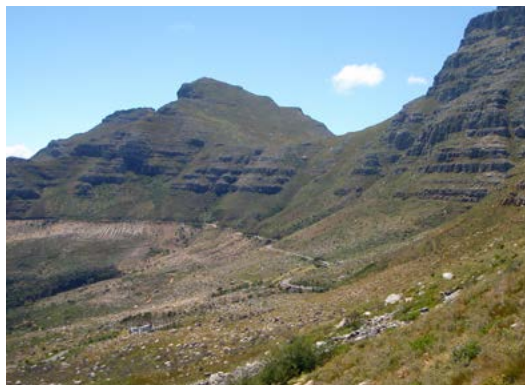

Visas

A landing fee is paid on arrival for all adults on board. This varies in cost for the length of stay. Up to 4 days is £12 per person (2013).

Entry Requirements

All yachts must clear in and clear out at Jamestown. Call St Helena Radio (ZHH) on VHF Ch 16 with your ETA when you are 10-20nm out. This will give the authorities time to prepare for your arrival. You will also be told to contact Port Control on VHF Ch 14.

On arrival in James Bay, either anchor in the east or take a mooring in the west. The buoys are flat and round with a securing eye in the middle. They are plastic and non-scratching. The yellow buoys are for boats up to 50ft and the red ones are for larger yachts. The moorings can be swelly but are secure. Moor with a warp through the securing eye, this may need to be attached to the stern and walked forward to the bow.

Clearances

Clearing in will be done on shore or onboard. In 2013, 50% of the yachts were visited. If asked to go ashore, visit Immigration first (next to the prison). Be prepared to show a copy of your health insurance information. Next, visit Customs in the clock tower building next to the swimming pool. Lastly, visit the Port Authority who are in the same building.

Clearing out is the same procedure and is always done ashore. Offices are closed after 1600 and at weekends.

NOTE: all crew require medical insurance if staying for longer than 48 hours (obligatory for World ARC because of 72 hr stopover). Available to purchase on arrival or show a print out of your policy when clearing in.

Prohibited Goods

Yachts must not import prohibited or restricted goods, and these must be declared on entry.

These include:

- Firearms and Ammunition
- Pornography
- Live animals
- Plants and parts thereof (including fresh vegetables, fruit and seeds) or soil

James Bay

General

Discovered in 1502 by a Portuguese navigator on his way home from India, the Island was uninhabited at the time. With its plentiful supply of water and food it quickly became a regular stop for ships on their return leg from India. Within a few years there was a vibrant community living there. Ravaged by the wars that were a frequent occurrence between the European countries, it lay abandoned for many years until the British East India Company started stopping there on a regular basis and forming convoys back to Britain. In 1659 a colony was established under Captain John Dutton with the blessing of Oliver Cromwell, and the Island remains a British colony to this day.

Most famous as the final prison of Napoleon at Longwood House, St. Helena is known as a political prison of the British Empire, with Zulus and Boers from Africa being held there. Along with them, the self-styled Sultan of Zanzibar (Seyyid Khalid Bin Barghash) was held in exile there before being transferred to the Seychelles.

The Island is mainly a volcanic landmass with lush inland forest and a small population of endemic plants. Imported plants of British descent have mostly replaced these. The coastal areas are barren, covered in volcanic rock and warmer than inland.

With many small and not-so-small rocks off the coast, the approaches to the Island can prove difficult to the unwary. However they give rise to some truly beautiful sights. With the Island's highest peak Diana looking down on Jamestown Bay and beaches running all around, the views are well worth the trip up.

Don't Miss

Jacobs Ladder: A stepped climb overlooking the harbour in Jamestown. Originally built to carry troops and supplies to the battery of guns that protected the harbour.

Longwood House: The home of Napoleon after his defeat at the battle of Waterloo. Now owned by the French Government.

Sandy Bay: An old lime kiln showing how lime was gained from burning sea shells and a large series of forts making a great walk.

Plantation House: The residence of the Governor and home for St Helena's oldest inhabitant, Jonathan the tortoise.

St Helena in the Southern Atlantic is half way between Africa and South America. Within the tropics the weather is mainly warm, but the trade winds and a strong cold current helps to cool the island. There is no marina, just one anchorage by Jamestown in James Bay called 'The Anchorage'.

Travel Information

The only way to get to St Helena is by boat, and RMS St Helena sails regularly between Cape Town and St Helena, and twice a year between the UK and St Helena.

Airport & Airlines

There is no currently airport on the island. Due to open in 2016.

Buses

There is a limited bus service. Timetable from the Tourist Office on Main Street.

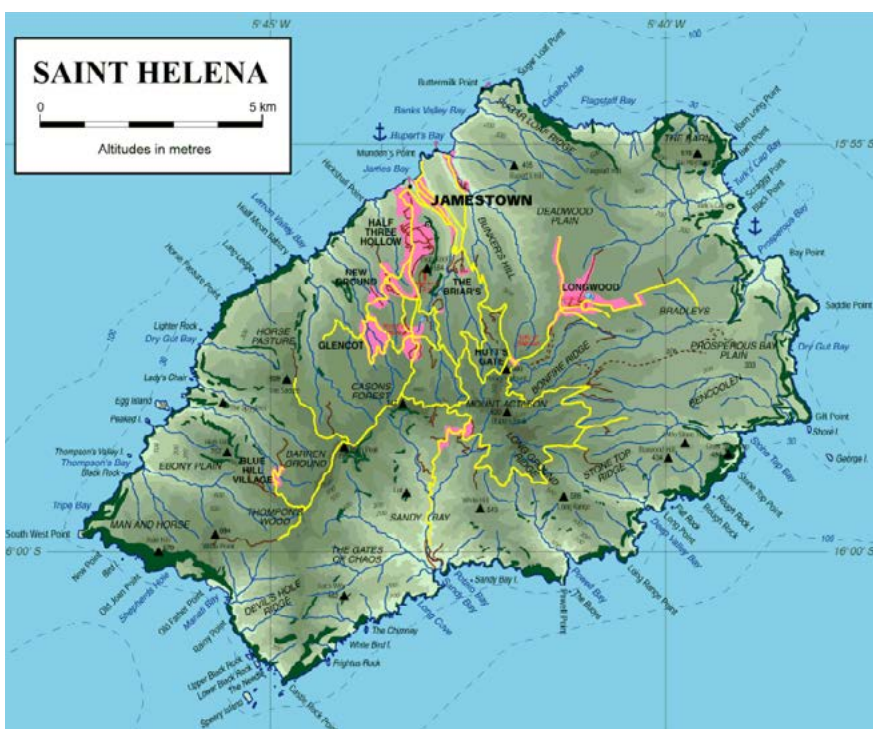

Fresh water can be obtained at the Landing steps but boats must provide their own containers or hose. Boats requiring replenishment by hose may do so by arrangement with the Harbour Master.

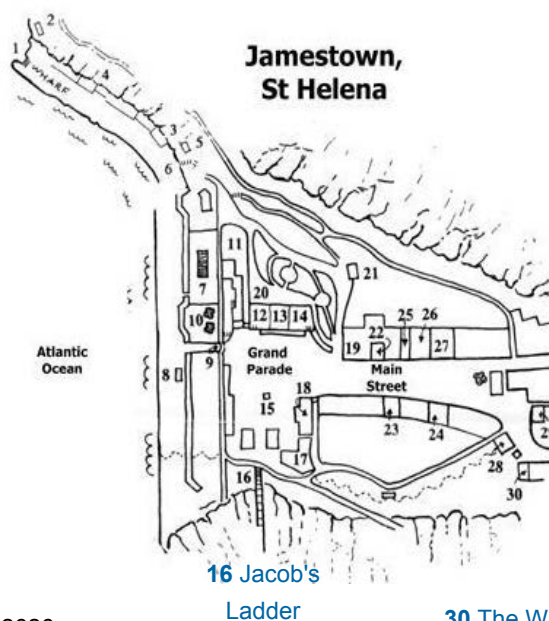

Visas

Most nationalities do not require a visa to visit Brazil for up to 90 days. However, visitors from **Australia, Canada, Russia, USA** and some **eastern European countries** will require a visa in advance. These can be obtained from the **Brazilian Consulate-General** in Cape Town: Triangle House 2nd Floor, 22 Riebeck Street, Cape Town Tel: +27 (0)21 421 4040 Open Mon-Fri 0900-1400. The process will take at least 5 working days, so please leave enough time.

Entry Requirements

Procedures for clearing into Brazil will be confirmed at the Skippers' Briefing in South Africa.

Security

Salvador can be summed up by its unofficial logo: Baia de Todos os Santos e de Quase Todos os Pecados (The city of all saints and nearly all sins). Remember you are back in South America and take appropriate precautions with your personal safety, and that of your yacht.

Brazil has extreme contrasts of rich and poor.

Follow these simple rules to improve your personal safety:

Don't wear precious watches or jewellery

Don't walk on empty or dark street, or on the beach at night

Don't use public toilets alone

Don't carry original documents. Keep them in a safe place and carry a photocopy of your passport.

Do carry only as much cash as you need, and only carry one credit/debit card.

General

Once the capital of Portugal's New World Colony, and still a major city of Brazil, Salvador is a wonderful place to visit. The main City is on a peninsular that overlooks the bay or Baia Todos os Santos (All Saints Bay), a mix of nations and cultures. Salvador is also known as 'Roma Negra' for the large amount of churches there.

Salvador is the hub of a huge art movement with a blend of many cultures and peoples coming together. With the majority of trade coming through Salvador during the latter stages of colonisation, the money generated was often put towards building churches and town buildings. Some of the most splendid examples of Latin Art in the world are to be found here.

Home to the Capoeira dance and martial art style you will find many groups practising all over the city. The scent of various foods and drinks drifting across the night air, transport you to a different and magical time.

Aside from the many attractions within the City World ARC's visit will coincide with carnival in Salvador on 06-11 February. Whilst this will mean that normal tasks such as provisioning and boat repair will require a little more planning, it will be worth it for the additional spectacle that carnival brings.

Grenada is one of the Caribbean's Windward Islands, and is affectionately known as 'the spice island' because of its famous spice plantations. Discovered by Christopher Columbus on his fourth expedition, the island is a lush and beautiful place with many sandy beaches, rain forests and an interesting history. It is one of the most relaxed islands in the Caribbean.

The US invasion in 1983 paved the way for a massive resurgence in tourism, and many multinational companies have invested heavily in Grenada, improving the general infrastructure of the island. Despite the expansion of tourism, much of the island is sparsely populated and it is possible to see the natural island.

Grenada is a haven for birds, and over 12% of the land is now designated official parkland and

sanctuary. Guided tours enable you to visit these areas without disturbing the wildlife. Well-known reserves include the Grand Etang Forest and La Sagesse estuary. With the mountains almost running down to the sea in places, and great beaches in others, there are lots of hidden inlets and bays to discover.

Don't Miss

Waterfalls: The Victoria falls are located at the foothills of Mount St Catherine in the parish of St Marks. Only accessible on foot.

Rainforest lakes: The Grand Etang lake is a natural crater, a relic of the island's extinct volcano, and is surrounded by lush rainforest.

Rum production: All around the island are many rum distilleries making rum the traditional way. Well worth a tour and some tasting – if you dare!

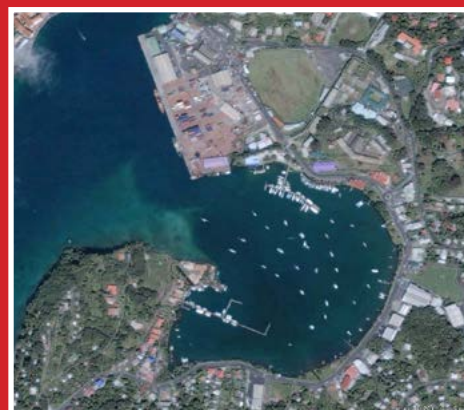

Mooring

Email the marina (docks@marigotbaymarina.com) with your ETA if you are planning to arrive before the formal rally programme. Radio the marina when within 2 miles, and again on entering the marina for a slip assignment. VHF Ch 12.

Mooring is likely to be stern to the wooden docks. Ground lines will be provided or bow lines should be taken forward to mooring buoys. The marina staff will help with mooring.

General

Saint Lucia is the second largest of the Windward Islands. Discovered by Christopher Columbus on 13 December 1502 - the 'Feast of St Lucy' - it was named Santa Lucia. Originally owned by the French, who first settled on the Island in 1650, it became a British dependency in 1814, and gained independence in 1979.

Take time to get away from the coast into the interior where the dramatic mountain scenery, rainforest and huge banana plantations will take your breath away. The volcanic peaks are topped by Mount Gimie, the highest mountain at 3117ft, but the island is better known for the Pitons, two dramatic peaks created when Mount Soufrière exploded.

Don't Miss

Soufriere. A small town to the south of Marigot Bay, overlooked by the impressive Pitons. In the vicinity of the town are the Botanical Gardens and Mineral Baths as well as the volcanic hot springs and 'Drive-In Volcano'.

The Pitons. The iconic landmarks of Saint Lucia lie just to the South of Soufriere Bay. It is possible to climb Gros Piton using a trail and staircase route. The 600m and 2 mile climb will probably take a reasonably fit person 2-3 hrs to complete. A permit is required, as is a guide. Both of which are obtained at the Interpretation Centre at the base of the mountain in the village of Fond Gens Libre. The fees are \$25.00 USD per person

Castries. The capital city of Saint Lucia is 25 minutes away by car. You'll find shops and places of interest to walk around in this busy port town.

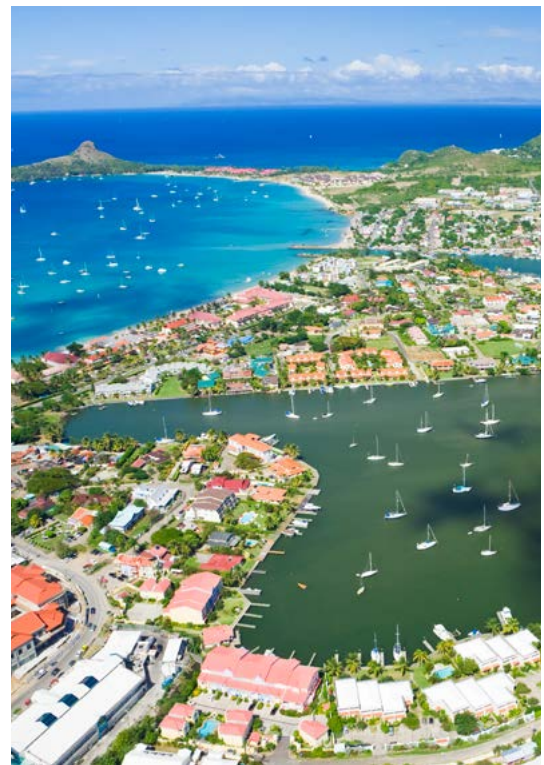
