### The Rally Handbook is the start of your global adventure!

Making a circumnavigation under sail is a tremendous achievement. You will return with an abundance of wonderful happy memories of new places visited, countries explored, friendships made and many ocean miles safely sailed.

Before you cast off your lines, this handbook is the key to preparing your boat and crew for the adventure that lies ahead. Being well-prepared will allow you to relax and enjoy the rally to the full, so I encourage you to read through each section, share the handbook with all of your crew, and to keep it onboard the boat for future reference. The Communications section provides details of the World ARC weather forecasts, sources of additional weather information, notes on expected conditions for each passage and advice on buying long-range communications equipment.

This handbook is intended to supplement the usual cruising reference books, and you should still carry copies of pilot books, almanacs, charts and lists of radio signals on the boat. We will provide a list of recommended pilot books and charts.

We will send you regular newsletters, reminding you of deadlines, special offers and other useful information. Don't forget that the World Cruising Club team are on hand to answer any questions you may have; we're only a phone call or email away.

I have been fortunate to join the World ARC fleet as they sailed from Fiji to Vanuatu and on to Mackay, and again from Mauritius to Reunion. Sailing with the fleet reminded me what it is really like to be a participant, and I can promise you that you are embarking upon a real adventure of a lifetime.

Sailing instructions for the leg will be provided in the start port. These will cover the start and finish lines, event timings and other specifics.

### **Rally Support**

### Skippers' Briefing


Before the departure we will hold a skippers' briefing, open to all skippers plus one crew from each boat.

### **About World Cruising Club**

World Cruising Club organises cruising rallies for yachts to destinations worldwide. Our best-known event is the Atlantic Rally for Cruisers (ARC), an annual rally for cruising yachts that has been crossing the Atlantic since 1986.

Since then, more than 5,000 boats from scores of countries have taken part in World Cruising Club rallies, looked after by our dedicated teams in every port en route. Our rally organisation ensures that participants are prepared for the voyage and supports them on their adventure.

World Cruising Club has offices in the UK and USA, and affiliates in Germany and the Netherlands. Please see 'Meet the Team' for full contact details.

### **ARC**

Every year the ARC brings together over 200 yachts from many nations. This popular rally starts at the end of November in Las Palmas de Gran Canaria and crosses to Rodney Bay on the Caribbean island of Saint Lucia.

# ARC Caribbean 1500 and ARC Bahamas

Since 1990, the Caribbean 1500 has been a popular way for north American yachts to cruise to the Caribbean for the sailing season. Starting in Portsmouth, VA every November, the rally sails to Tortola BVI, and the ARC Bahamas fleet sails to Green Turtle Cay.

### **ARC USA**

The partner rally to ARC Europe, ARC USA departs Tortola BVI and sails either to Bermuda before the yachts head to east coast ports or directly to Ft. Lauderdale via the Old Bahama Channel.

### **ARC Europe**

ARC Europe is a cruising rally crossing the Atlantic from west to east at the end of the Caribbean sailing season. Participants include yachts returning to Europe, as well as north American yachts starting a summer cruise to Europe. ARC Europe has two starts, in Tortola BVI and Portsmouth VA, and calls at Bermuda, before cruising the Azores and finishing in Lagos, Portugal.

### **ARC Baltic**

Combining "six capitals in six weeks" this new

rally will offer a different focus from our transocean events; days cruising at sea, combined with an exploration of the Baltic's fascinating culture and history, will take you on a 1,500nm voyage of discovery through Europe's "east sea". The first edition of the rally will take place in 2014.

### **ARC Portugal**

This rally crosses the Bay of Biscay, then day sails the coast of Portugal to finish in the Algarve in time for the Mediterranean season, exploring ashore with tours and social activities in every port. ARC Portugal starts in Plymouth, UK, in early June finishing in Lagos, Portugal, three weeks later.

### **Malts Cruise**

A relaxed cruise around the lochs and islands of western Scotland, enjoying the wildlife and scenery. The cruise visits several distilleries, and there are opportunities for whisky tasting en route. Chartering a local boat is a popular option for the Malts Cruise.

### **Seminars**

We run a series of seminars in the UK, Germany and USA for sailors interested in our events. Our experienced lecture team focus on the preparations for yacht and crew, and also provide helpful hints about undertaking the voyage. These vary from 2 hour panel discussions held at boat shows, to 2 day residential courses.





### Imray Chart 100 North Atlantic Ocean Passage Chart

Chart 100 is an important companion for the Atlantic yachtsman on passage and an excellent source of planning information.

- At 1:7,620,000 covers the North Atlantic from Brazil to Newfoundland
- Conical projection enabling Great Circle tracks to be plotted as straight lines.
- Contours, limits of ice, magnetic variations
- Key routes as identified by D M Street.
- Notes on the routes and small wind rose charts showing excessive wave heights and storm frequencies for April to July and October to December.
